The Making a Difference (MAD) Crew consists of 12 passionate and diverse young individuals from across the Great South Coast. The Crew's main objective is identify issue young people are facing, and work towards embedding positive change within their communities.

Formed in 2021, the Making a Difference group was established to address recommendations from of the initial Youth Conversation Research Initiative: Strengthening Career and Pathway advice for young people.

Throughout 2023, the Crew are focusing on codesign, advocacy and leadership. The group has held four virtual meetings, and participated in Youth Affairs Council Victoria workshops, including "Running Great Workshops" and "Advocacy Training." These sessions, led by young peer facilitators, took place in person in Portland and Warrnambool. The MAD; Crew found the Training Workshops empowering and inspiring.


