### //Future Me

BTB was extremely happy to receive funding from the Federal Government, through the Safer Communities Fund, to commence the "Future Me" program.

Designed to support 12 to 19 year old students at risk of disengaging with education. The program works in conjunction with secondary schools and agencies to build capacity in students to continue with their education or training in order to pursue employment and career pathways.

Future Me will to promote connection and engagement with education and learning, in line with Beyond the Bell's vision.

Students in this initiative are divided into two cohorts:

12 to 14 years: This cohort investigates how their current schooling will connect to future pathways to employment or further education, with the goal to enhance the meaningfulness of education and training.

15 to 19 years: This cohort focuses more comprehensively on individual career pathways post school, including the education and training pathways to chosen careers.

#### Intended Outcomes:

- 1. Increase student self-efficacy in learning,
- 2. Increase student motivation to attend school.
- Build student knowledge if career pathways, including required education and/or training,
- 4. Increase student self-efficacy in employment (15 to 19 year old cohort).

### //Youth Conversations update

The first meeting of the Youth Conversation Reference Group was held on March 28, with nine passionate young people living across the Great South Coast.

Working with project officer Rachel Wilks and former BTB executive officer Kate Roach, the group:

- Spent time getting to know each other through a series of icebreaker and introduction activities
- Examined the nine recommendations from the Youth Conversation Research Report
- And shared their thoughts on the recommendations they were drawn to, and why these were the most important to them.

A second meeting on May 2 explored the specific recommendations selected by the reference group members to consider how implementation may look.

They also heard from guest speaker Karen Walsh, from YACVIC, regarding their personal strengths and how to highlight them, and options for future training to help in the delivery of this Youth Conversations project.

The Engagement in Learning-Glenelg Phase 2 'Teach the Teacher' Project successfully conducted the first workshop on the February 23. Hosted by Heywood Consolidated School, the program had 40 year 4-6 students representing eight primary schools from across the Glenelg Shire participating and sharing their experience.

Schools involved include:

- Bolwarra Primary School
- Bundarra Primary School
- Casterton Primary School
- Dartmoor Primary Schools
- · Heywood Consolidated School
- · Merino Consolidated School
- · Portland North Primary School
- · Narrawong Primary School

The 'Teach the Teacher' program will consist of 5 workshops across the year, supported by Victorian Student Representative Council (VicSRC). The aim of the program is to embed student voice in developing school practices resulting in long term cultural change. The program allows students to drive change at school by collecting thoughts and opinions of their peers and leading collaborative conversations with teachers, school leadership and staff.

In a coup for the region, this is only the second time that multiple schools across a shire have participated together in the ten years Teach the Teacher has operated. Usually, schools participate individually in the program.

We look forward to the next workshop in May.

This project is an initiative of the BtB Glenelg Local Action Group.
