//Level Up



The Level Up project conducted its' first hybrid Project Steering Committee Meeting on 25 June 2022. The project has received Expression of Interest applications from potential Delivery Partners for review from a carefully select Selection Panel who will meet 13 September 2022.

The Level Up project will focus on social and emotional well-being, engagement in education and learning, and development of aspirations for future career pathways. The project will also deliver tailored programs linking youth needs to transferable vocational skill development activities. Level Up will also promote social, emotional, and educational skill development and provide support during and post placement.

In a truly collaborative approach, Level Up will be delivered to secondary school students at risk of disengaging from education across the Great South Coast by multiple service providers for the duration of 2023.

Thank you to everyone who has had input or shown interest in this project, we are excited to see it roll out in 2023.






The Youth Conversations Reference Group - Making a Difference; South West Vic has been hard at work, with meetings on 20 June 2022, 18 July 2022 and 8 August, and one planned for 17 October.

The group has selected two recommendation from the Youth Conversation Research Report to focus on and implement during the rest of the year - "Strengthen careers and pathways advice for young people" and "Support young people, teachers and schools with trauma-sensitive learning approaches".

The young people have been involved in planning the Portland Careers Expo, designing careers aspiration signs for the day and volunteering on the day. They met with Marianna DeLiseo from Brotherhood of St Laurence, Cathryn Walder from Live4Life and Kathryn Ozwald from Stratus Legal Group (organisers of the Portland Careers Expo) to make sure a youth voice was represented in the planning.

The Portland Careers Expo will be held on the 14 September 2022, at Portland Civic Hall.

Finally, we welcome Ricky Davies as the new Project Officer for Youth Conversation Phase 2 Project.
